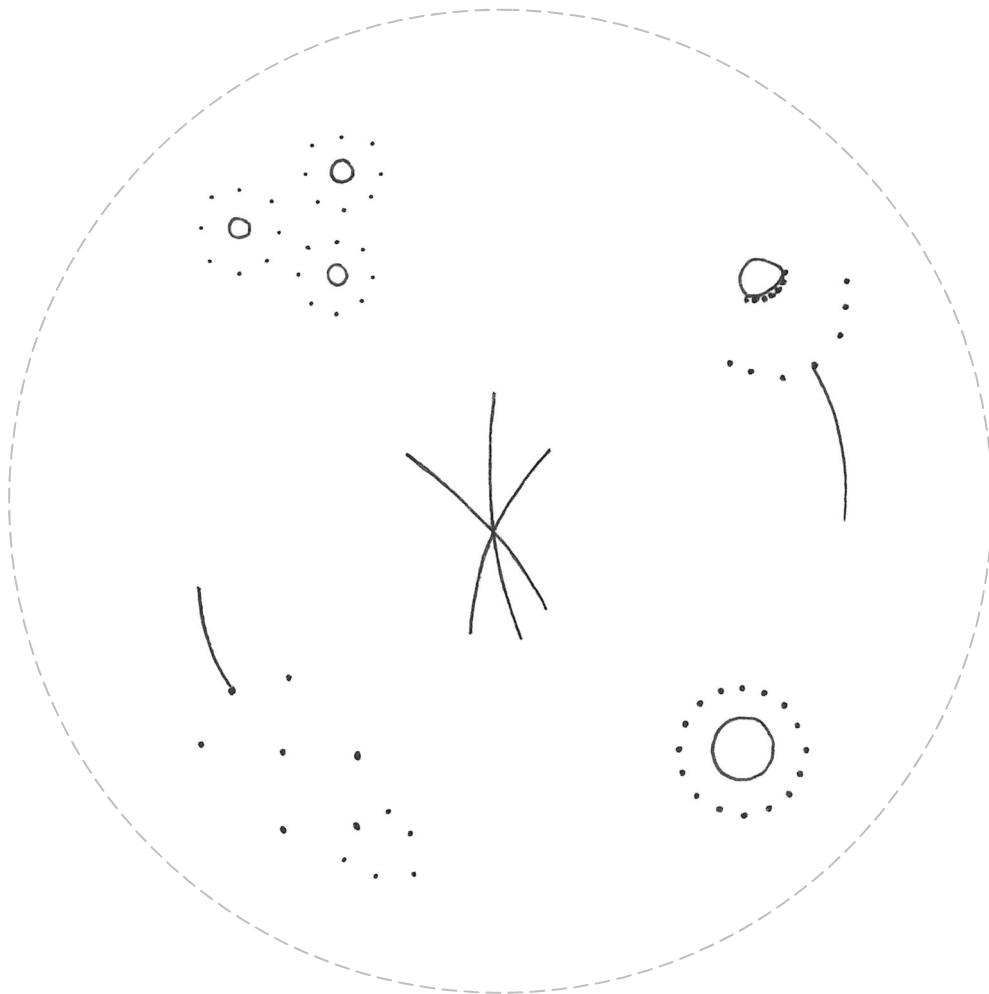
5 embroidered flowers sampler



Print off this page and trace the lines below onto your fabric with a waterproof or erasable transfer pen. Go over the designs with a black pen first if you can't see them clearly through the fabric or you can use the prick and pounce method or carbon transfer paper. Frame the fabric into your embroidery hoop and if you are using a cotton fabric place a backing behind your embroidery fabric to give you a more stable ground to work on.

Outline design for transfer

Note: Make the dots as small as possible so they are easy to cover with your stitches! The outer circle is just to mark where the edge of a 5" frame comes, you don't need to mark this on.



Level: beginners and those who love flowers!

This sampler is a wonderful way to learn how to stitch some flowers with just a few simple stitches. The stitches repeat themselves and you don't need many materials (see below for the colours I used, but substitute these for any colours you like!). You will need:-

A printer to print off this design! The outline design is the size I worked.

Threads

Stranded cottons in the following colours:

White & yellow for the Daisies

Bright pink and dark purple for the Fuchsia

Mid pink, orange and dark red for the Echinacea

Bright yellow and dark brown for the Sunflower

Light purple and mid green for the Lavender

I also used the following, all available from www.sarahhomfray.com:

Fabric

- Linen twill (you can use any fabric you like but I suggest something made of natural fibres such as cotton, linen or linen/cotton blend).

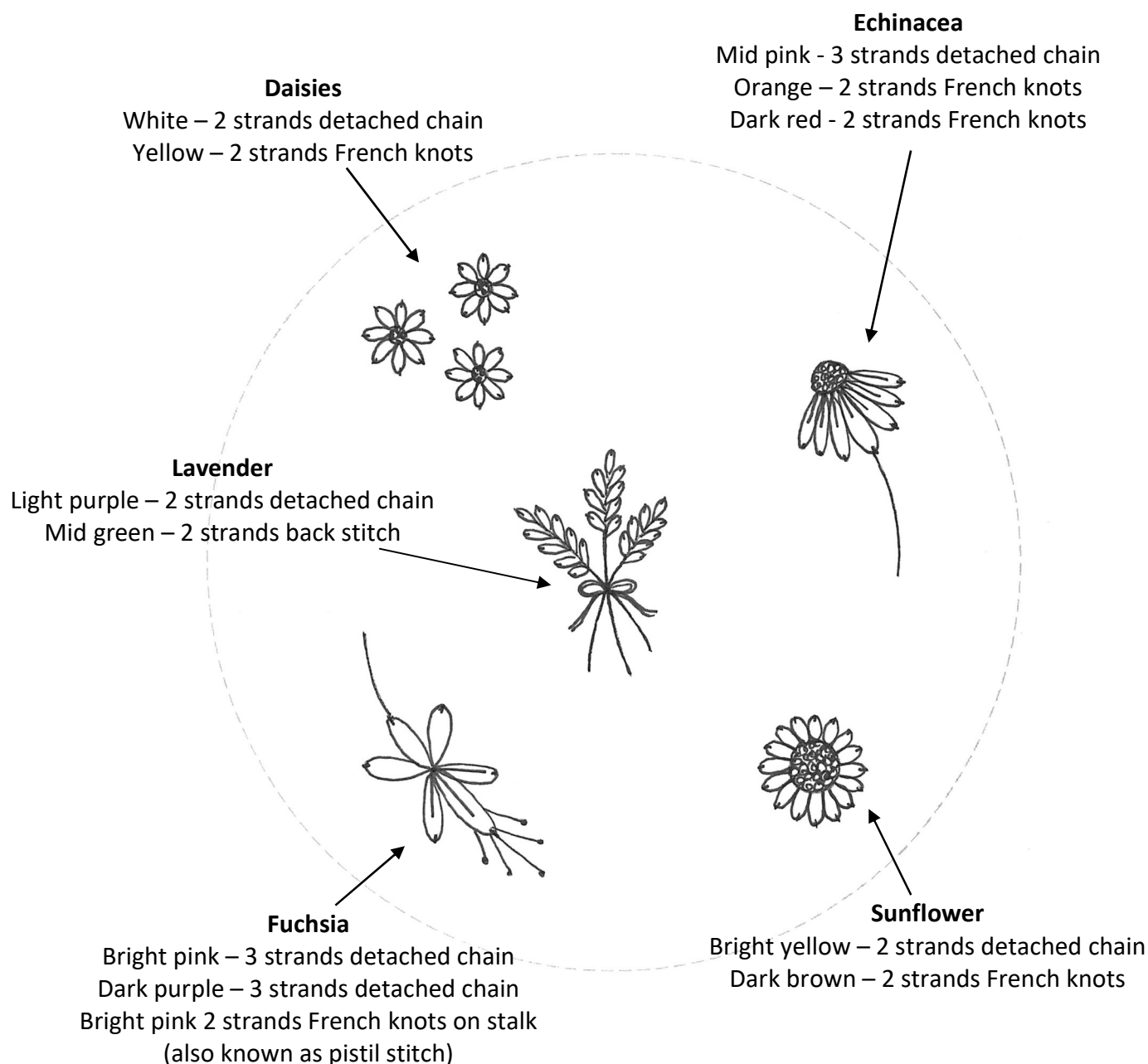
Needles

- Crewel size 7

Other

- Embroidery scissors
- 5" embroidery hoop
- Waterproof or erasable design transfer pen
- Versatile table clamp to hold my frame still
