
Creative goldwork rose



Watch my video '5 Creative Goldwork Techniques' to have a go at this Creative goldwork rose design.

Print off this page and trace the flower centre circles below onto your fabric for the centre of your flower (this makes a 5cm diameter flower).

Circles to trace and placement of elements




Petal and leaf templates



Cut 8 petal shapes out of leather (or more if you want to work the gathered petal) Cut one of each of the above leaf shapes out of leather

Stitch Plan (to work as I have in the video)



You will need:-

A printer to print off these pattern pieces

Materials I used:

- Leather for the flower petals and leaves
- Metal purl wire (Pearl purl)
- Bright check purl
- Plate ribbon

Fabric

I've stitched this design onto a cotton fabric with a cotton calico backing

Other items you will need:

- Ordinary matching sewing thread to sew down your leather and metals
- Embroidery scissors and scissors for gold metals
- Paper scissors to cut out the pattern pieces
- Needles, suggested embroidery size 10
- Beeswax
- Embroidery hoop or stretcher bars to fit your background fabric
- Optional Versatile table clamp to hold the frame still

Stitch order

- 1) Trace your circles onto your fabric to mark the centre of the flower and the placement of the other elements
- 2) Cut out the paper templates
- 3) Cut out your leaf shapes and stitch in place on the outer circle
- 4) Cut your petals out and stitch into place on the circle indicated on page 1
- 5) Stretch, cut and bend your metal pearl purl into shape and stitch down on the circle indicated on page 1
- 6) Make your bright check ball and sew down in the centre circle
- 7) Curl your plate ribbon and stitch into place around the bright check ball
- 8) Add on worms and tendrils if you like!
