Free Design


Leaf shapes



Print off this page and trace the leaves onto your fabric. Go over the design with a black pen first if you can't see it clearly through the fabric or you can use the prick and pounce method or carbon transfer paper.

Frame the fabric in/on to your embroidery frame; place a cotton fabric behind your embroidery fabric to give you a more stable ground to work on.

Design for transfer

You will need:-

A printer to print off the design!

Threads I used:

A mix of stranded cottons and DMC Coton A Broder (see stitch plan) but you really can work these stitches in any thread you like. Do some samples to see what works best for you!

Fabric

- I used a cotton embroidery fabric but any natural fabric (cotton, linen, silk) will work well
- Calico background

Needles

This depends on what threads you use but an embroidery No. 9 and 7 will be good for most threads. Check out our video on needles if you aren't sure how to choose the right one.


Other

- Embroidery scissors
- Ring frame or bar frames to fit your design
- Waterproof or design transfer pen
