
Stem stitch versus outline stitch – getting technical

The difference and when to use which!

Stem stitch and outline stitch are essentially the same stitch that forms a twisted rope effect. The difference between them is that the twist of the 'rope' goes in opposite directions; stem stitch has a 'Z' twist and outline stitch has an 'S' twist:



Some shapes have both clockwise and anticlockwise directions (the letter **S** for example starts anticlockwise from the top and finishes in a clockwise direction) so pick whichever stitch you find the easiest and stick to it (don't switch half way through)! **TIP:** Shorten the stitches a little to get around the awkward curves.
